




The First Noel







Caroling has been popular in France for centuries.... French carols are called *noels*. The poor often sing in the streets during the season, and money is tossed to them from the windows

On December 4th, St Barbara's Day, lentils are soaked and planted in a bowl so that they will be well grown by Christmas Eve. The bowl of growing green blades is placed next to the creche as a symbol of an offering of a living thing.

The creche is of great importance in the French home at Christmas. Candles are lighted in front of the creche on Christmas Eve and are kept burning until Epiphany. On Christmas Eve the house cat is well fed since, for some unknown reason, it is considered bad luck if she cries on the sacred night. Some French families believe that the Christ Child brings gifts on Christmas Eve. Others are looking to Bonhomme Noel (Father Christmas or "The Good Spirit of Christmas") as their gift-giver. The Children place their shoes by the fireplace to be filled.


Midnight Mass on Christmas Eve is attended by great numbers. In the olden days the French people took food with them and dined in the church after the mass. Today after mass, many families hold suppers in the homes or in restaurants and these are known as the *Reveillon*.



The DAC tuning is useful for tunes written in the NATURAL minor, or the HARMONIC minor keys.

The natural minor is arranged: X - 1 - 1/2 - 1 - 1 - 1/2 - 1 - 1

The harmonic minor has a RAISED 7th step, which arranges it: X - 1 - 1/2 - 1 - 1/2 - 1 1/2 - 1/2
